LGBTQ RELIGIOUS HISTORY INTERNSHIP

The LGBT Religious Archives Network (LGBT-RAN) is offering an academic year (October 2018- April 2019), part-time, online internship to further preservation of and research on the history of LGBTQ religious movements around the world.

The ideal intern would be enrolled in or recently graduated from a graduate program of public history or LGBTQ studies and seeking opportunities to expand their learning with hands-on experience in creating historical and/or educational resources in the arena of LGBTQ religious history for a wider audience online. The intern would work in collaboration with the LGBT-RAN staff (Coordinator, Archivist and Web Technician) while undertaking their own independent projects. Since LGBT-RAN is a wholly digital enterprise, the intern can work from any location. The intern would be expected to work five hours a week and can pursue academic credit.

Possible intern projects—to be negotiated in line with the academic interests and pursuits of the intern—are:

- Conducting oral history interviews;
- Developing educational resources for the high school or university classroom;
- Creating online exhibitions on a subject of LGBTQ religious history;
- Generating podcasts drawn from interviews with historical persons; and/or
- Carrying out LGBT-RAN's commitment to a diverse historical record by documenting LGBTQ religious history in communities of color or in international settings.

The LGBT Religious Archives Network (www.lgbtran.org) is an innovative venture in preserving history and encouraging scholarly study of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender religious movements around the world. LGBT-RAN has a two-fold basic purpose. First it assists LGBTQ religious leaders and groups in determining how best to preserve their records and papers in appropriate repositories. Secondly, LGBT-RAN provides an electronic information clearinghouse for these archival collections and other historical data about LGBTQ religious history for the use of historians, researchers and other interested persons.
