But in my senior year, I became President of our Fraternity,

from a friend that Jimmy Ford, a new pledge, was gay. Well,

Angel: Because the gay people <sup>in Denver</sup> chose you, and the <sup>Methodist</sup> Bishop appointed

you there, and ~~because~~ ~~God~~ ~~wanted~~ ~~it~~, ~~and~~ ~~because~~ ~~God~~ ~~wanted~~ ~~it~~.

There is no task that's easy  
 No longer a time that's slow  
 There's no land, except in dreams  
 Where peaceful waters flow  
 Life cannot be serenity.

So we went to work, <sup>and we worked hard, very hard,</sup> and our small group grew quickly  
 into a bustling <sup>center for helping people with AIDS</sup> ~~place~~, <sup>and having moved back to</sup> ~~place~~ <sup>Denver</sup> and within 4 years, we had

became a 3 million dollar operation, ~~to help people~~  
 But we ~~still~~ remained a loving safe place for our clients.

a right to die group which ~~had~~ <sup>has</sup> national offices in Denver and Portland

Oregon. I had <sup>already</sup> created a group in the ~~at the AIDS Project~~ Project, that

helped many of our clients in die peaceful deaths.
